Succession to the Austenasian Throne – CLOSED SESSION	
The Council sat in closed session. The Emperor informed the Council, as well as invited non-voting advisors, that Emperor Jonathan I was preparing to abdicate and that he had been	

identified as a favourable successor, owing to Crown Princess Caroline's reluctance to assume the throne. He further stated that any agreement to accede to the Austenasian throne would be conditional on a constitutional amendment to reverse Austenasia's prohibition on same-sex marriage. He further stated that there was no chance of political union between Adammia and Austenasia, but that a loose confederation or "United Empire" was a possibility. Council members and invited observers offered thoughts and asked questions. The observers departed on the 21st of March. The Emperor then stated that an agreement with Austenasia was looking less likely as it was believed that a consitutional amendment on same-sex marriage would be unlikely to reach 80% support in the House of Representatives, but that he believed he might find sympathetic people in the Austenasian Senate and that he might have an opportunity to directly address the Senate for a sort of interview.

Note that contributions from anyone other than the Emperor have not been included as this was a closed session.
